Science

Next week in science (Thursday afternoon) we will be exploring our sense of taste by tasting a variety of foods. The children will be describing the tastes using vocabulary like sweet, sour, bitter and salty. We have an up to date medical list and we will not give children any foods that we know they cannot have. They will only have a small taste of each item and the foods will be: rocket, dark chocolate, pretzel, olive, lemon, lime, sponge cake and strawberry. They will have the option to try each food but they don't have to. Please let us know if there's anything you don't want your child to try and we are also happy for you to pop in on Thursday morning if you want to look at any ingredients. Thank you.

Haslemere Food Bank Donations - Each year at harvest we ask that you donate what food items you can to the Haslemere Food Bank. This year we are asking you to send in your donations with your child on **Wednesday 8th October** where they will take it to the church and place it on the alter. From there it will be sent to the food bank to be distributed to those in need. We have been told that they need the following items:
