French

The Date: The children will learn to recall and recognise the 7 days of the week and 12 months of the year. They will revise numbers 1-31 and learn to ask and answer 'Quelle est la date aujourd'hui?' and 'C'est quand ton anniversaire?'

PSHE- Valuing difference

In this PSHE unit, we will explore and celebrate differences, including religion, culture, and social media influence, using SCARF lessons through discussion and practical tasks.

RE – Why is the idea of rescue so important to Christians, and how does the Bible show this?

This unit builds on pupils' understanding of the Christian 'big story'—God's relationship with humanity from Creation to the Second Coming. It explores the theme of rescue as central to this narrative, examining how the Bible presents God as a rescuer throughout.

Science

Our science focus is: Properties and changes of materials. In this unit, children will find out about the different materials that exist and how they are used in daily life. They will explore where materials come from or how they are made, then focus on how materials are used in construction and production of buildings.

Art

Children will explore installation art, justify their opinions, and evaluate their box designs as if full-sized spaces. They will suggest improvements to create different atmospheres, develop a plan or model, and describe their creations and adjustments made during the process.

PE

In PE we will be following Real PE Unit 2 and Real Dance Unit 1 focussing on the fundamental skills of shapes- turning and jumping to create levels and creating dances whilst exploring the 'Social' multi-ability cog.

Our PE days this half term are Monday and Thursdays.

Computing

In Computing, the children will explain what a search engine is, suggest things online that aren't real, explain why keywords are important and recognise the terms 'copyright' and 'fair use'.

Geography

In this unit, we will explore the question, 'What is life like in the Alps?' Children will learn about mountain climates and why people visit the Alps, focusing on Innsbruck's human and physical features. They will then apply their learning locally by investigating tourism, mapping recreational land use, and presenting their findings.

Music

We will now be following the KAPOW scheme for Music and our focus will be Blues. The children will learn to identify blues music, sing in tune, explain chords, and play the C chord 16 times.

English

This term, children will explore historical fiction through Treason, using the text to inspire rich narrative writing. They will analyse character, setting, and plot, build tension, and write from different perspectives leading to a polished extended narrative. Alongside this, they will develop key Year 5 skills, including using cohesive devices, enhancing vocabulary, describing atmosphere, integrating dialogue, and editing their work for impact., Our whole class reads are: Treason by Berlie Doherty and Tudor Tangle by Steven Vinacour.

Maths

Our Maths units this half term are:

- Multiplication and division
- Fractions

Our KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts) this half term are: ***I can identify prime numbers up to 20***
