DT

Food: Eating seasonally
We will discover when and where fruits and vegetables are grown. Learning about seasonality in the UK and the relationship between the colour of fruits and vegetables and their health benefits by making three dishes.

PE

In Real PE we will be learning the fundamental movement skills of footwork and balance and exploring the 'Personal' multi-ability cog. Furthermore, the children will have a weekly gymnastic lesson developing the skills of travel and rotation.
Our PE days this half term are Wednesday and Friday.

French

Our introduction to French will include basic greetings and getting to know each other. The children will play games in French and learn a French song with actions. Advanced speakers will study French fiction and non-fiction books.

Computing

In computing we will be learning about online safety: 'fake news', privacy settings, ways to deal with upsetting online content, protecting our personal information on social media.

PSHE

Our PSHE unit is: Me and My Relationships. We will be following the SCARF lessons to use a combination of discussion and practical tasks to explore some of the challenges that arise from friendships.

History

Looking at chronology of mankind from the Stone Age to today, children are introduced to Britain's Story. Using archaeological evidence, children learn about the changes from the Stone to the Bronze Age and answer historical questions. Identifying the limitations of this type of evidence and reconstructing the life of the Amesbury Archer.

RE

In RE we will investigate the key question: 'What's the Bible's 'big story' – and why is it like treasure for Christians? Through two contrasting retellings of the 'big story', children will begin to explore some core theological concepts using the Big Bible Story to help them.

Music

Musical Spotlight: Writing Music Down.
Long and short The children will explore the notes, crotchets and minims within the music they learn and see how these notes can fit on the lines and spaces of a stave.

Science

Our science focus this term is: Forces and Magnets. This unit will teach the children about forces, friction and magnetic attraction. The children will learn about forces in the context of pushing and pulling, and will identify different actions as pushes or pulls. The children will work scientifically and collaboratively to investigate friction, by exploring the movement of a toy car over different surfaces.

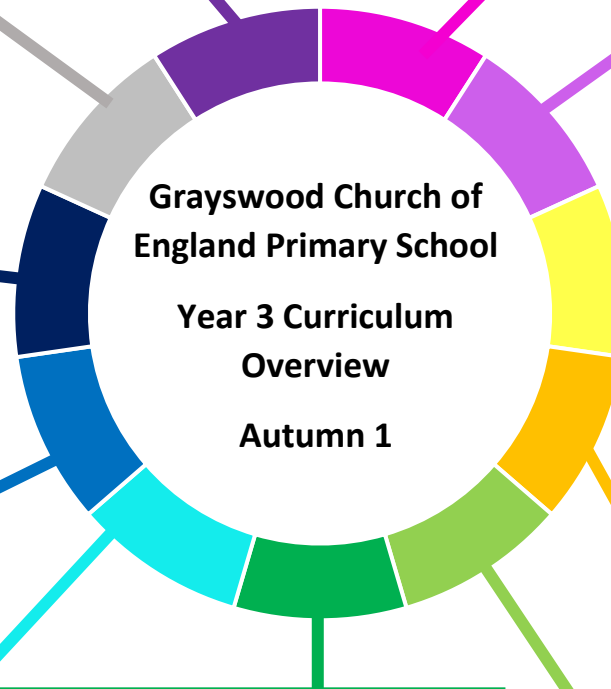
Maths

English

In English we will be using stories by a familiar author (Roald Dahl) to write character descriptions and revise key skills of formal letter writing. The children will follow the formula of a chapter to plan, write and edit a new one using their own perfect prank!
Our whole class reads are: The Twits by Roald Dahl, and The Nothing to See Here Hotel will be our reading for pleasure book.
