Art

This term the children are exploring and creating Ancient Egyptian art, guiding pupils in understanding and applying the styles, patterns, and techniques of Ancient Egyptian art through lessons that include designing scrolls, making paper, and creating contemporary responses using zines.

PE

In PE we will be using the real Gym scheme of work to focus on flight and climbing sequences and in real PE we will be focusing on the cognitive skills of coordination and counter balance.

Our PE days this half term will be Monday and Wednesday.

French

Family and Friends: This unit teaches the children how to identify and introduce family and pets and spell their names. They will also learn the names for places in their own home.

Computing

Our computing sessions will be based on communicating with technology. The children will understand what emails are and how to send one, learn to create an email with an attachment and understand how to spot fake emails.

PSHE

Our PSHE unit is: Rights and Respect
We will use a combination of discussion and practical tasks to understand how we can help each other stay safe, investigate what we can do to be helpful citizens and explore key questions related to money.

Geography

This term, our topic question is: Who lives in Antarctica? The children will Learn about latitude and longitude and consider how this links to climate. We will contemplate the tilt of the Earth and how this impacts the Antarctic circle and global temperatures. They will explore the physical features of a polar region and investigate how humans have adapted to working there.

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RE

In RE we will investigate the key question: 'What are important times for Jewish people?' by exploring some of the major Jewish festivals, making links with Jewish history and commandments, and reflect on how celebrating these events helps Jewish people to 'remember' and binds the Jewish community together.

Music

The children will be revising key musical terminology, playing and creating pentatonic melodies, composing a piece of music and use layered melodies around the theme of Chinese New Year.

Science

The broad theme for British Science Week in the UK is 'Time'. This half term, Kingfishers will be specifically looking at, 'Time to Set Sail'. We will explore the purpose and suitability of materials, look at the relationship between forces and materials and apply this to designing and making a boat.

Maths

Our Maths units this half term are:
- Fractions
- Mass and Capacity
The children will use concrete and pictorial representations to support their understanding.
Our KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts) this term: **to recall facts about durations of time**

English

We will use the book The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, to support the writing of a new chapter. Furthermore, we will use the traditional tale, Hansel and Gretel to write a persuasive advert and investigate the structure of the poem, The Sound Collector by Roger McGough before writing our own poetry.
Our whole class reads are: I was there... Boudica's Army by Hilary McKay and The Iron Man by Ted Hughes.
